Presenting ourselves to Christ by Fr. Thomas Manuel

"I shall enter Your house, O Lord, I shall worship in Your Holy Temple."

In the life and Tradition of the Church, there is an important action that occurs at the beginning of a child's life. Forty days after their birth, the child and mother are brought into the assembly of the people of God. For the mother, this is her first time back in Church since giving birth to the new child and her reentry into the life of the community. For the child, they are presented to the assembly of the people of God. More importantly, the child is brought before the icon of Christ the Judge upon the Iconostasis (Icon Screen) and presented to the Lord of the universe publicly for the first time.

This small liturgical act mirrors what occurs on the feast of the Presentation of the Lord into the Temple, celebrated forty days after His Nativity, on February 2nd. In the Gospel of St. Luke we read,



Message from Fr. Thomas continued...

"At that time, the parents brought the child Jesus up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord (as it is written in the law of the Lord, "Every male that opens the womb shall be called holy to the Lord") and to offer a sacrifice according to what is said in the law of the Lord, "a pair of turtle doves, or two young pigeons." (Luke 2:22-23)

Christ is brought into the Temple and offered back to God the Father as is the tradition of Israel, the holy people of God. The aged priest Symeon takes Christ the baby in his arms and declares,

"Master, now you are dismissing your servant in peace, according to your word; for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you have prepared in the presence of all peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and for glory to your people Israel." (Luke 2:29-32)

In like manner and in direct imitation of Christ Himself all Orthodox children born into the faith follow the same course as Christ. All are brought into the Temple of the living God. All are presented before Christ as Symeon presented the Christ the child to the Father. All are offered back to God in thanksgiving.

This act of presentation is a beautiful image for our whole Christian life. The act of presenting a child before the icon of Christ is an icon for how we are to live our whole life in Christ. Sometimes we over complicate our Christian life. We get mixed up and mired in the details and particulars of the Spiritual life and the life of the Church in general. But in fact, our Christian spiritual life is quite simple. It is all contained within that simple act off Presentation of the Lord we saw two thousand years ago, and which we see every time we present a new child into the Church. We are called to present our life to Christ in all that we do, in all who we are. It is that plain and simple.

Christ calls us to be present, to be in His midst, to stand before Him and to be united to Him Salvation for us in the Orthodox Church is none other than to be united to Christ. To unite our time, our free will, and our whole life to Christ our God."

We repeat over and over again in the Divine Liturgy, "Let us commit ourselves and one another and our whole life to Christ our God."

For parents and those caring for children, this idea of presentation has an added factor. Not only is it the duty of every individual to present themselves to Christ in their own life, it is more so the duty of every parent to present their child to Christ as well. How do parents present their children to Christ? Simply put, being present! The best thing a parent can do for a child is to bring them to Church. Bring them to church often and get them engaged in the life of the church. For the children to have a relationship with Christ they need to be where Christ is, inside the church. One who is married cannot expect to have a successful, blessed and prosperous marriage if they are never near or around their spouse. In life fashion, for one to have a deep and abiding relation with Christ they need to be with Him, near Him, in His midst! Bring your children to church! Present your children to Christ at all times. Everything that God gives us is a gift, including our children. God gives us our children so that we can present them back to Christ. We are the stewards and the caretakers of children for a short time. Our goal with our children is to present them back to Christ so that they may have life and life abundant.

We held a General Assembly to discuss the opportunity in detail with parishioners, where it was decided that we'd conduct additional research to advance the acquisition process. Members of the Future Planning Committee (FPC) Iso shared about the opportunity with His Eminence during a visit to his offices in New Jersey. Just like you all, he was highly impressed with the location and the growth potential, and he was so thankful for all the work our community has collectively done to help bring us to this point in our journey to building a permanent home in Loudoun County. The FPC held church property tours so that parishioners could see the worship space, classrooms, fellowship spaces, etc. up close and personal. Thank you to everyone who attended! The FPC also held several informational sessions and will continue to host them to address specific questions from the community. Thank you for your participation!

Looking ahead, we will hold another General Assembly (February 9th) to discuss our research findings and the latest updates with regard to the acquisition process. 

forward to participating!


